- If you arrive late to school in the morning and your designated entrance door is locked, please come to the front main doors of the school and check in with Mrs. Painchaud and Mrs. Hanson.
- If you need to drop something off for a student, please bring it to the main office. If there is no one in the office, please be sure your child's name is on the item and we will deliver it to them.
- Please remember to call (306-778-9270) or email the school when your child is absent. If you email your child's teacher, please include Mrs. Painchaud (https://prescriptors.org/nchange-16 and Mrs. Hanson (mhanson11@chinooksd.ca) in the email. We will not assume your child is staying home if they were home sick the day before. We appreciate your help with this!
- To ensure of your child's safety, please do not drop-off or pick up your child in the staff parking lot area. We are asking that you please use George Street for all drop-offs and pick-ups.
- Emergency Lunches If a student forgets their lunch, they first phone home to see if someone is available to bring them lunch. If this is not possible, as a last resort, we will have items on hand for an emergency lunch to be made.
- The Ice Hut (school store) is now open for Grade 5 & 6 students on days 1, 3, and 5, and for Grade 7 & 8 students on days 2, 4, and 6!
- We are now using the front east door to enter our school, and the front west door to exit.

- ★ O.M. Irwin School is using the same pick-up and drop-off guidelines as last year, with the exception that parents may wait in the main foyer to pick-up their child(ren).
- ★ Please drop-off and pick-up your child(ren) outside of the school at the designated entrances. The designated entrances are:
 - o North East Entrance -Grades 3, 4, 5, and 6.

- Please access the school via George Street to drop off and pick up your child(ren). Use the crosswalk and crosswalk lights when crossing George Street.
- ★ Parents and Guardians, please refrain from dropping off or picking your child(ren) in the staff parking lot and Chinook SD bus layover.

Band Memo from Ms Jersak

Here are a few reminders regarding transporting band and instruments on the bus:

Small instruments (Flute/Piccolo, Clarinet, Oboe) are to be held on your lap or placed in your backpack.

Medium Instruments (Bass Clarinet, Bassoon, Alto Sax, Trumpet & Trombone) are to be stored under the seat in front of you.

Large instruments (Tenor Sax, Baritone Sax, French Horn, Guitars, Electric Bass) are to be placed securely in the space in front of the seat as close to the front barrier of the bus as possible.

Transportation of equipment to and from school is allowed following the guidelines outlined within, as long as capacity on the bus exists. Priority is given to the transportation of children to and from school and if room is unavailable for large carry-on items, they may not be transported on the bus.

HOW WE UNINTENTIONALLY UNDERMINE OUR CHILD'S CONFIDENCE

WHEN WE CONTROL INSTEAD OF COACH

We make it all about us.

When we say: "That's not how you do it. Let me show you."

They think: "I guess Mom can do it better than me."

WHEN WE DON'T SHOW TRUST

We don't believe our child might have the capability to do a new task.

When we say: "Go ask your Dad to help you."

They think: "My mom doesn't trust I can do it. She thinks I need help."

WHEN WE FOCUS ON "THE RIGHT WAY"

We don't consider child's approach to a task.

When we say: "Are you sure that's how you want to do it?"

They think: "I must be doing this the wrong way."

WHEN WE EVALUATE

We put judgment instead of fostering a child's internal evaluation.
When we say: "You didn't ask for help and look what happened."

They think: "I guess I don't need to try doing things on my own."





CONFIDENCE ISN'T A GIFT WE CAN GIVE OUR CHILDREN.

TRUE CONFIDENCE IS LEARNED THROUGH EXPERIENCES OF TRYING NEW THINGS, EXPERIENCING FAILURE AND SUCCESS, AND_BY HAVING THE EMOTIONAL SUPPORT TO COPE WITH ALL OF IT.



WHAT TO SAY INSTEAL

- Coaching = "Here's how I do this; maybe it will work for you.
- 🍠 Trust = "That's not the way I do it, but give it a try. That approach might work!
- Not focusing on perfection = "You persisted with that project even though it was difficult."
- Focusing on progress = "You have improved your organizational skills so much."
- Process praise = "I love how you wrote so descriptively in that book report."
- Noticing = "You must feel proud; that project took a lot of work
